The Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) leads to conferral of the Bachelor of Science in Human Sciences. Graduates are qualified to apply for a post-baccalaureate CADE-accredited supervised practice program (e.g. Dietetic Internship), in order to be eligible to take the registration exam for dietitians.
