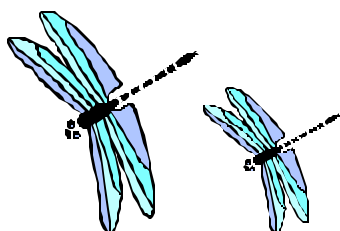

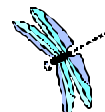


Plan to attend the 2002 ESA Southeastern Branch Meeting?

Entomology in Art

E.A. Seguy

Numerous artists and designers throughout history have drawn inspiration for their creations directly from the unparalleled diversity and beauty present in nature. E.A. Seguy was one such designer who was prolific from the turn of the century through the 1930's. He produced 11 albums of illustrations and patterns of which *Papillons* and *Insectes* were dedicated to insect subjects. He was a masterful decorative artist who spanned the art eras of Art Nouveau through Art Deco. His graphic technique was achieved through hand coloring prints through numerous plate stencils. Seguy's work inspires artists and designers in such diverse applications as textiles, end papers, wallpaper, stained glass, and packaging.
