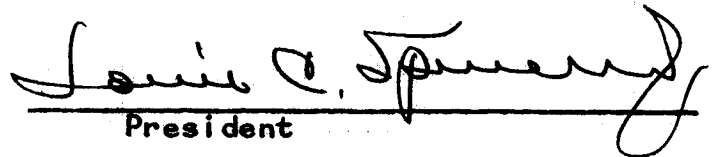

At a call meeting of the Mississippi State University/^{Development} Foundation, held on the 13th day of October, 1961, the following resolution was duly and legally adopted by the association, to-wit:

"Upon motion by Mr. Boswell Stevens, which was seconded by Mr. H. E. Allen, the committee voted to empower Mr. Spencer and President Colvard to select a group of four to six people to confer with them and legal counsel with a view toward framing the charter to create the foundation."

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I, Louie C. Spencer, Jr., as President and Jabus C. Redd, as Secretary, of the Mississippi State University/^{Development} Foundation, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a true, accurate, and correct copy of a resolution, duly and legally passed at a meeting of said foundation, on the 13th day of October, 1961.

1. The corporate title of said company is:
MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY ^{DEVELOPMENT} /FOUNDATION, INC.
2. The names and post office addresses of the incorporators, all of whom are adult resident citizens of the State of Mississippi, and who are authorized by said organization, in its minutes, to apply for this charter, are:

3. The domicile of said corporation in this State is:
Room 115 Lee Hall, P. O. Box 1469, State College, Mississippi.
4. The said Corporation is nonprofit and no shares of stock are to be issued.
5. The period of existence shall be perpetual.
6. The purposes for which the Corporation is created, not contrary to law, shall be:

To operate exclusively for educational and scientific purposes, all for the public welfare, and to this end to promote, encourage, and assist all forms of education and research at Mississippi State University; to receive, solicit, accept, and hold, administer, invest, and disburse funds for such educational and scientific purposes, either generally or, upon request of donors, for such specific types of education or research as may be approved by said University; to acquire property, real, personal or mixed, by purchase, gift, devise or bequest, unconditionally, or in trust for specified purposes within the limitations of this charter; to convey, re-invest proceeds, and other-

in aiding, supplementing, improving and enlarging the educational and research facilities and activities of Mississippi State University, including, but not limited to supplying or supplementing such salaries of professors and research specialists as may be needed to provide and maintain a highly competent faculty, to acquire and operate specialized laboratory equipment, to erect memorial buildings, to establish scholarships, to provide for advanced study by selected faculty members, and to pay expenses, fees or honoraria for visiting lecturers, and to make provisions for permanent separation of funds donated for specified purposes when so accepted by the Corporation with the approval of the University; to receive gifts and make financial and other types of contributions and assistance to educational and scientific institutions, incorporated or nonincorporated, which are exempt from Federal income tax. All the assets and earnings shall be used exclusively for the purposes herein set out, including the payment of expenses incidental thereto; and no part of the net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; and no part of its activities shall be for the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation or participating or intervening in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

The granting of all funds for such educational and research purposes to be initiated and carried out only upon the recommendations of the administrative authorities of Mississippi State University; and the rights and powers that may be exercised by said corporation in addition thereto are those conferred by the provisions of Chapter

in event of the dissolution of this corporation, all of its property and assets, after payment of all of its obligations, shall be and become the property of the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning of the State of Mississippi, or their successors, for the use and benefit of Mississippi State University, conditioned, however, for the perpetual use for said Mississippi State University for the purposes set forth in this Charter.

7. Said corporation shall not be required to make publication of this charter, shall issue no shares of stock, shall divide no dividends or profits among its members, expulsion shall be the only remedy for nonpayment of dues, if any, there shall be vested in each member the right to one vote in the election of all officers, the loss of membership, by death or otherwise, shall terminate all interest of such members in the corporate assets, and no liabilities shall attach against the members for corporate debts, but the entire corporate property shall be liable for the claims of creditors.
