Mississippi State University Libraries celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month with an exhibit on the 2nd floor of Mitchell Memorial Library. The exhibit highlights Latinx culture and includes images from MSU Special Collections, as well as books by Mississippi State Latinx authors, and Spanish translations of works by authors including Eudora Welty, Tennessee Williams, and John Grisham. Also included are material documenting political efforts of the Latinx community in the 20th century, from the collections of former members of Congress Mike Espy and David Bowen, and the Delta Ministry Papers. All items come from MSU Special Collections, including the Manuscripts, Rare Books, and University Archives Divisions, and the Congressional and Political Research Center.
